What is OneCare Vermont?

It's a new partnership among doctors at The University of Vermont Medical Center, Dartmouth-Hitchcock, nearly every hospital in Vermont, and hundreds of other primary care providers and specialists statewide. OneCare Vermont is designed to make it easier for doctors and hospitals to work together to keep you healthy and to provide you with high quality care in the right place, and at the right time.

OneCare Vermont is an Accountable Care Organization (ACO). An ACO is a group of hospitals, doctors, and other health care providers who have decided to work together to make sure all patients, especially those with chronic conditions, get the best quality, coordinated care. Being part of an ACO is about improved collaboration between providers and a shared commitment to improving the health of the Medicare fee for service patients we serve.

The OneCare Vermont ACO is not an insurance plan or company, nor is OneCare Vermont a Medicare supplemental insurance plan or a Medicare Advantage HMO.

Will my Medicare benefits change?

No. OneCare Vermont will not change your Medicare benefits.

- You may still see your current doctors and are free to choose any doctor or hospital that accepts Medicare.
- OneCare Vermont will not change your premiums or out of pocket costs.
- OneCare Vermont will not change your prescription drug benefits including Medicare Part D.
- Any supplemental insurance plans you may have will not be affected by OneCare Vermont.

Will my care be different?

Because improving your health is the number one goal of OneCare Vermont, your providers may focus more on helping you make healthy choices. If you have a chronic condition like diabetes or heart disease, there may be extra support for you between visits with your doctors.

How will OneCare Vermont benefit me?

- Your doctors and other providers will focus on wellness, preventing illness and managing chronic conditions – all intended to reduce your need for treatments and/or stays in the hospital.
- If you have several doctors caring for you, it will be easier for them to share test results and other information so they can make the best decisions about your care. This will improve planning and reduce duplication of services.
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- Your providers will work together to deliver safe, high-quality care to you.

Is my doctor an OneCare Vermont participant?

What if my doctors are not part of the OneCare Vermont network? Or what if I receive care while I am away from Vermont?

There will be no impact on you as a Medicare beneficiary – you are free to see any provider you choose, regardless of whether or not they are a OneCare Vermont participant. This includes doctors and hospitals that are out of state.

Do I need to sign up for OneCare Vermont?

No, you do not need to do anything! If your physician is participating in OneCare Vermont, you will receive a letter with additional information. Medicare will share billing data with us about the services you have received. This information will help your doctor provide you with high quality care. You can ask Medicare not to share your billing data with us by completing a Decline to Share Personal Health Information form or by calling OneCare Vermont or Medicare at the phone number below.
